This guide includes 10 conversation starters you can use to open meaningful discussions with your kids about faith, truth, and life.

These questions work great during:

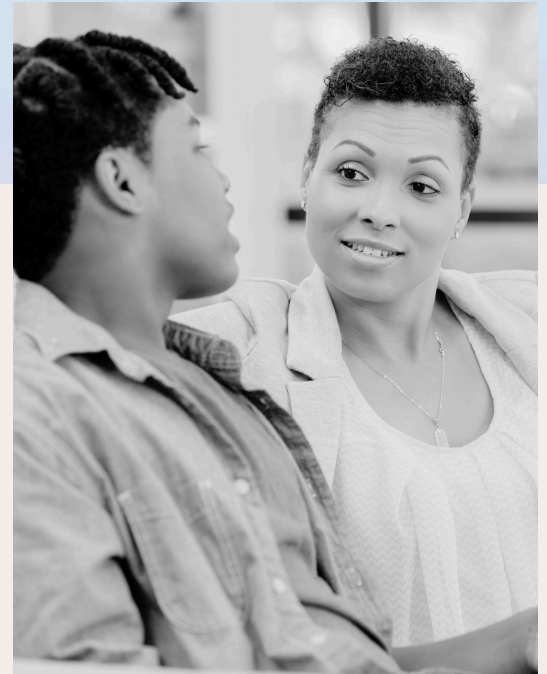
- car rides

Ask follow-up questions.

Explore Scripture together.

Sometimes the best discipleship moments happen when we simply **invite our kids to think deeply about God and the world He made.**



10 Questions to get you started...

“Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, the fruit of the womb a reward.”

— Psalm 127:3

Question 1: What do you think is the biggest problem in the world today?

This question reveals how your child sees the world and opens the door to talk about sin, brokenness, and our need for Jesus.

Follow-up:

Why do you think that problem exists?

Question 2: Why do you think people need Jesus?

Let your child explain the gospel in their own words.

Follow-up:

What do you think Jesus came to do?

Question 3: What do you think makes a person truly “good”?

This question opens a conversation about righteousness, grace, and salvation.

Follow-up:

Do you think anyone can be perfect?



Question 4: When you see something beautiful in nature, what does it make you think about God?

This is a great question for conversations in the garden, on a walk, or outside.

Follow-up:

What do you think creation tells us about God?

Question 5: What do you think faith really means?

Many kids think faith simply means believing something without evidence.

Follow-up:

Why do you think we can trust God?

10 Questions to get you started...

“Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, the fruit of the womb a reward.”

Question 6: Why do you think God created families?

This question helps children think about God’s design for relationships.

Follow-up:

What do you think parents are supposed to teach their kids?

Question 7: What does forgiveness really mean?

Kids experience forgiveness regularly but often don’t understand it spiritually.

Follow-up:

Why is forgiveness sometimes hard?

Question 8: If you could ask God one question, what would it be?

This question gives insight into your child’s heart, doubts, and curiosity.

Follow-up:

Why do you think that question matters to you?



Question 9: What does it mean to love people the way Jesus loved people?

This helps kids connect faith to everyday actions.

Follow-up:

Who do you think is hardest to love?

Question 10: What do you think God wants your life to be about?

This opens the door to talk about calling, purpose, and serving others.

Follow-up:

What gifts do you think God has given you?

Discipleship in the home rarely looks dramatic. It often looks like simple conversations, repeated questions, and small moments of curiosity.

But those moments matter.

God uses ordinary conversations to plant seeds of truth in your children's hearts.




You may never know which question sparks a moment that shapes their faith for a lifetime.

So keep asking.

Keep listening.

Keep pointing them to **Jesus**.
